A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING WATER AND SEWER RATES

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Town of Hayden, Colorado provides the Waterworks System through its municipal water enterprise as established by Chapter 13 of the Hayden Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 9.7 Town Utilities of the Town of Hayden Home Rule Charter and Chapter 13 Water and Sewer and Section 13.60 of the Hayden Municipal Code, rates for municipal water service are established by resolution (Ord 710).

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAYDEN, COLORADO THAT:

- Section 1. Water and sewer rates shall be comprised of a base charge and a usage charge. Effective the monthly billing period ending January 2022, the Town hereby sets its monthly water rates as per attached Exhibit "2022 Water and Sewer Rates and Trash Rates".
- Section 2. Beginning on January 1, 2022, the water rates established in Exhibit "2022 Water and Sewer Rates and Trash Rates" of Resolution 2022-02, is updated, and the water rates established this Resolution, as adjusted annually, shall be adjusted the first day of January of each year by 3% for water and sewer use and base rates.
- <u>Section 3.</u> This Resolution shall be in full force and effective immediately upon its adoption.

BACKGROUND REVIEW: As performance and creative arts operations at the Hayden Center mature and become more numerous, further involving the community would be helpful. As a mechanism to do so, creation of the Hayden Arts Commission is being created. Members of the Commission will provide guidance and recommendations to Council, Town Manager and Arts Director in an advisory capacity.

The attached By-Laws are modeled after the Hayden Economic Development Commission By-Laws, and the advisory structure of the Arts Commission will operate in generally the same manner.

RECOMMENDATION: Hayden Town Council approve and adopt the Hayden Art Commission By-Laws as proposed.

MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION/COMMENTS: I concur with this recommendation.

BYLAWS OF THE HAYDEN ARTS COMMISSION

Article I – Name

The Town Council for the Town of Hayden (Council), pursuant to its authority under the Town of Hayden Home Rule Charter, established the HAYDEN ARTS COMMISSION on February 3, 2022.

Article II – Purpose

The Hayden Arts Commission (HAC) advises the Council, Town Manager and Arts Director regarding the Town of Hayden's (Town) arts programs and educational opportunities including visual arts, literary arts, performing arts and other similar activities based at the Hayden Center and throughout the community. When requested, the HAC will also advise the Town on any art related issues such as promoting the arts in Hayden, partnerships between the Town and other arts organizations, and the facilitation and management of arts related events. Broadly, listed below are tasks that the HAC will work to achieve:

- A. Formulation of arts goals and objectives based on established strategic plan/plans as adopted by the Town Council; and
- B. Adoption of an arts strategic business plan (as set forth and adopted by the Town Council) and implementation of that plan through arts strategies; and
- C. Promotion of arts in the Town of Hayden; and
- D. Fundraising for arts purposes; and
- E. Assist with volunteer solicitation and coordination; and
- F. Any other activities related to arts that could provide or help with the implementation of the Town's arts strategic plan/plans.

Article III – Members

<u>Section A.</u> The HAC will be comprised of five (5) members and three (3) alternates as appointed by the Town Council. Membership shall include one voting representative from the Town Council. The rest of the HAC members shall be comprised of individuals interested in the arts and who bring a broad range of arts-related interests including, but not limited to, visual arts, performance arts, literature and spoken arts, practicing artists, organizations that support and further the arts in Town, and passionate community members at large.

<u>Section B.</u> Each member shall serve for a term of two (2) years or until a successor shall be appointed. However, all members shall be eligible for re-appointment after the expiration of their terms.

<u>Section C.</u> Alternates may participate at all meetings; however, alternates shall, with full voting privileges, sit as regular members if regular members are not present at a meeting. If a regular member is in attendance after the meeting commences, they may sit as a member starting with the next item on the agenda following their arrival. Any sitting alternate must give up their seat immediately following completion of the agenda item in the order of appointment, Alternate 1 first, Alternate 2 second, Alternate 3 third until a full commission is again met.

<u>Section D.</u> Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired term and shall be made in the same manner as original appointments by the Town Council.

<u>Section E.</u> No member of the HAC shall receive any compensation for such membership.

<u>Section F.</u> Members of the HAC may be removed by motion and majority vote of the Town Council.

Article IV - Officers

<u>Section A.</u> The members of the HAC shall elect/appoint one member to be Chairperson, one member as Vice Chairperson, and one member as Secretary. These officers shall perform the duties prescribed by these bylaws and by the parliamentary authority adopted herein. The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the HAC. The Vice Chairperson shall act as Chairperson during the absence of the Chairperson with all the powers herein granted to the Chairperson.

<u>Section B.</u> The officers shall be nominated and elected by ballot or nomination to the floor and vote at the HAC's first regular meeting of the calendar year to serve until the HAC first regular meeting of the following calendar year, or until their successors are elected.

Article V – Support Duties

The Secretary for the HAC shall keep a full and accurate account and record of all meetings of the HAC.

<u>Section A.</u> The HAC will be supported by Town staff in an administrative capacity with the Arts Director being the Executive Director for the HAC with all the powers that come with the Arts Director position. The Town Manager may at his/her discretion appoint other Town staff members to serve HAC if and when budget may allow. Those staff members shall be staff of the Town and supervised by the Town Manager per the Town of Hayden Home Rule Charter.

Article VI - Meetings

<u>Section A.</u> The regular monthly meetings of the HAC shall be held on the ______ of each month. Each HAC member will be expected to be in attendance unless a call to Town staff or the Chair is received to the contrary.

<u>Section B.</u> Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson or upon written request of three members of the HAC filed with the Secretary of the HAC. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated at the time of the request. In all cases, a minimum of twenty-four hours' notice shall be given.

<u>Section C.</u> All regular monthly meetings shall be posted at a designated posting location 24 hours in advance. The designated posting location will be the Town Hall posting bulletin board.

Article VII – Committees

<u>Section A.</u> Committees may be appointed by the Chairperson as approved by a vote of a majority of members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. The Chairperson shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.

<u>Section B.</u> Each committee shall be comprised of no less than two members of the HAC. A committee chairperson shall be appointed by the Chairperson as approved by a vote of a majority of members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. The HAC may also appoint citizens, business owners or qualified professionals to serve on a committee.

<u>Section C.</u> It shall be the responsibility of each committee to submit reports of each committee meeting to the Chairperson and Secretary of the HAC for inclusion in the meeting records of the HAC.

Article VIII – Parliamentary Authority

The provisions contained in the Town of Hayden Home Rule Charter shall be the governing document of the HAC and all duly appointed committees. The conduct of any business of the HAC shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Town of Hayden Home Rule Charter.

Article IX – Amendment of Bylaws

Recommended bylaw amendments may be adopted at any regular meeting of the Town Council by a two-thirds vote provided that the proposed change has been submitted in writing and recommended by a two-thirds vote of the membership of the HAC. Said amendments shall be effective upon their approval and adoption by the Town Council.

BACKGROUND REVIEW: Over the last twelve (12) months, staff and the Planning Commission have been working through Development Code revisions in follow-up to the adoption in January 2021 of the Hayden Forward Master Plan as well as some community member identified issues. The Development Code has also been reorganized to make the document easier to read and use.

It is anticipated that a public hearing will be held at a joint Planning Commission/Town Council meeting scheduled for February 17, 2022. Subsequent to the public hearing, the Planning Commission will make their final recommendation to the Town Council for Council's consideration for approval, followed by the public hearing and consideration of the second reading of Ordinance No. 711.

RECOMMENDATION: Move to approve 1st Reading of Ordinance 711, An Ordinance Amending the Hayden Municipal Code by Adopting and Reenacting Title 7: The Hayden Development Code; Repealing All Conflicting Ordinances; Providing for Severability; and Providing an Effective Date and set a date of February 17, 2022 for a Public Hearing.

MANAGER RECOMMENDATION/COMMENTS: I concur with the recommendation.

ORDINANCE NO. 711

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE HAYDEN MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADOPTING AND REENACTING TITLE 7: THE HAYDEN DEVELOPMENT CODE; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the authority for the Town of Hayden ("Town") to adopt regulations concerning the use, subdivision and development of real property is provided by Article XX of the Colorado Constitution and the Town of Hayden home rule charter; Article 65.1 Areas and Activities of State and Local Interest, Article 65.5 Notification of Surface Development, Article 67 Planned Unit Development Act of 1972, and Article 68 Vested Property Rights of Title 24, Colorado Revised Statutes; Article 20 Local Government Regulation of Land Use of Title 29, Colorado Revised Statutes; and Article 12 Annexation – Consolidation – Disconnection, Article 15 Exercise of Municipal Powers, Article 16 Ordinances – Penalties, Article 20 Taxation and Finance, Article 23 Planning and Zoning, and Article 25 Public Improvements of Title 31, Colorado Revised Statutes; and other applicable state and federal laws and regulation; and

WHEREAS, numerous work sessions were held by the Hayden Planning Commission ("Planning Commission") to inform, provide direction and review the proposed amendments to the Title 7, Hayden Development Code, Hayden Municipal Code (HDC); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the requirement	ents of the HDC, and after providing proper
notice, a public hearing was held at a joint mee	eting of the Planning Commission and Hayden
Town Council ("Council") on	, 2022 to solicit public comments, and after
considering all public comments received and	testimony and materials provided by Town staff
the Planning Commission provided a recommend	ation to the Council to adopt and reenact the
Hayden Development Code; and	

WHEREAS, the Council specifically finds that the proposed revisions to the Hayden Development Code meet the review criteria in Section 7.16.040(c) of the Hayden Development Code; including:

- 1. The adoption and reenactment of the Hayden Development Code promotes the health, safety and general welfare of the Hayden community; and
- 2. The adoption and reenactment of the Hayden Development Code promotes or implements the goals and policies of the Hayden Forward Master Plan; and

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3. The adoption and reenactment of the Hayden Development Code is necessary or desirable to respond to changed conditions, new planning concepts or other social or economic conditions.

WHEREAS, approval of this Ordinance on first reading is intended <u>only</u> to confirm that the Town Council desires to comply the requirements of the Hayden Home Rule Charter by setting a public hearing in order to provide the public an opportunity to present testimony and evidence regarding the application and that approval of this Ordinance on first reading does not constitute a representation that the Council, or any member of the Council, supports, approves, rejects, or denies this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAYDEN, COLORADO THE FOLLOWING:

<u>Section 1. Recitals Incorporated</u>. The above and foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by reference and adopted as findings and determinations of the Town Council.

<u>Section 2. Enacted.</u> Title 7: Hayden Development Code, attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit A is hereby adopted and enacted.

Section 3. Codification Amendments. The codifier of the Town's Municipal Code is hereby authorized to make such numerical and formatting changes as may be necessary to incorporate the provisions of this Ordinance within the Hayden Municipal Code. The Town Clerk is authorized to correct, or approve the correction by the codifier, of any typographical error in the enacted regulations, provided that such correction shall not substantively change any provision of the regulations adopted in this Ordinance. Such corrections may include spelling, reference, citation, enumeration, and grammatical errors.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance, is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. The Town Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each provision thereof, even though any one of the provisions might be declared unconstitutional or invalid. As used in this Section, the term "provision" means and includes any part, division, subdivision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase; the term "application" means and includes an application of an ordinance or any part thereof, whether considered or construed alone or together with another ordinance or ordinances, or part thereof, of the Town.

<u>Section 5. Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance, immediately on final passing and adoption, shall be published in accordance with Section 3-3h of the Home Rule Charter and recorded in the Town Book of Ordinances kept for that purpose, authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and Town Clerk. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on March 1, 2022 after its publication in accordance with Section 3-3h of the Hayden Home Rule Charter.

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Section 6. Safety Clause. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that this Ordinance is promulgated under the general police power of the Town of Hayden, that it is promulgated for the health, safety and welfare of the public, and that this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and safety and for the protection of public convenience and welfare. The Town Council further determines that the Ordinance bears a rational relation to the proper legislative object sought to be obtained.

<u>Section 7. Repealer</u>. All bylaws, orders, ordinances, resolutions, and other instruments or parts thereof that are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed only to the extent of such conflict. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any bylaw, order, ordinance, resolution, or other instrument, or part thereof, heretofore repealed.

Section 8. No Existing Violation Affected. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to release, extinguish, alter, modify, or change in whole or in part any penalty, liability or right or affect any audit, suit, or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing which may have been incurred or obtained under any ordinance or provision hereby repealed or amended by this Ordinance. Any such ordinance or provision thereof so amended, repealed, or superseded by this Ordinance shall be treated and held as remaining in force for the purpose of sustaining any and all proper actions, suits, proceedings and prosecutions, for the enforcement of such penalty, liability, or right, and for the purpose of sustaining any judgment, decree or order which can or may be rendered, entered, or made in such actions, suits or proceedings, or prosecutions imposing, inflicting, or declaring such penalty or liability or enforcing such right, and shall be treated and held as remaining in force for the purpose of sustaining any and all proceedings, actions, hearings, and appeals pending before any court or administrative tribunal.

Section 9. Public Hearing on Ordinance No. 711. A public hearing on this Ordinance will be held on February 17, 2022 at the regular meeting of the Hayden Town Council beginning at 7:30 p.m. at the Hayden Town Hall, 178 West Jefferson Avenue, Hayden, Colorado.

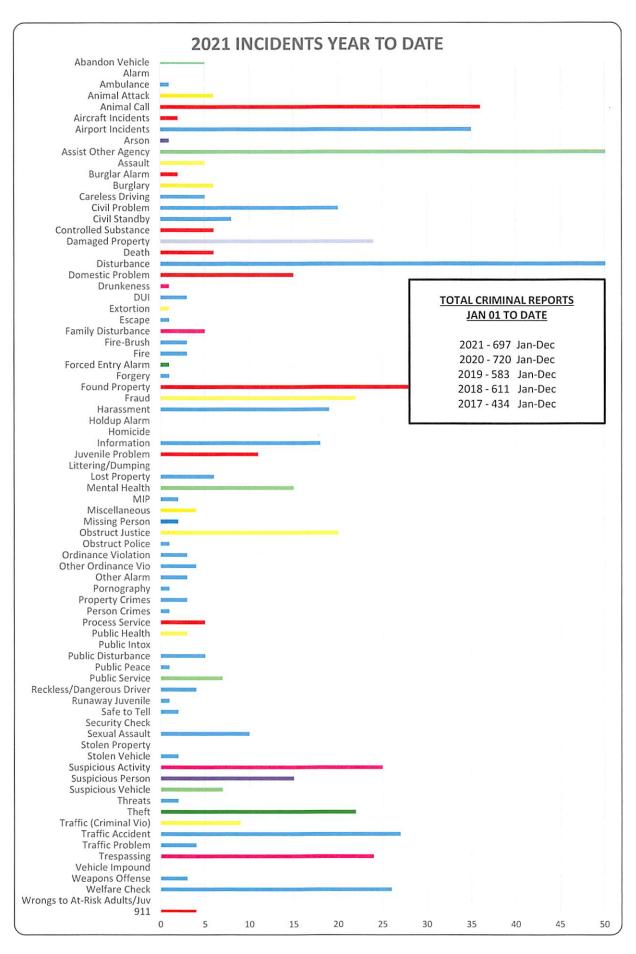

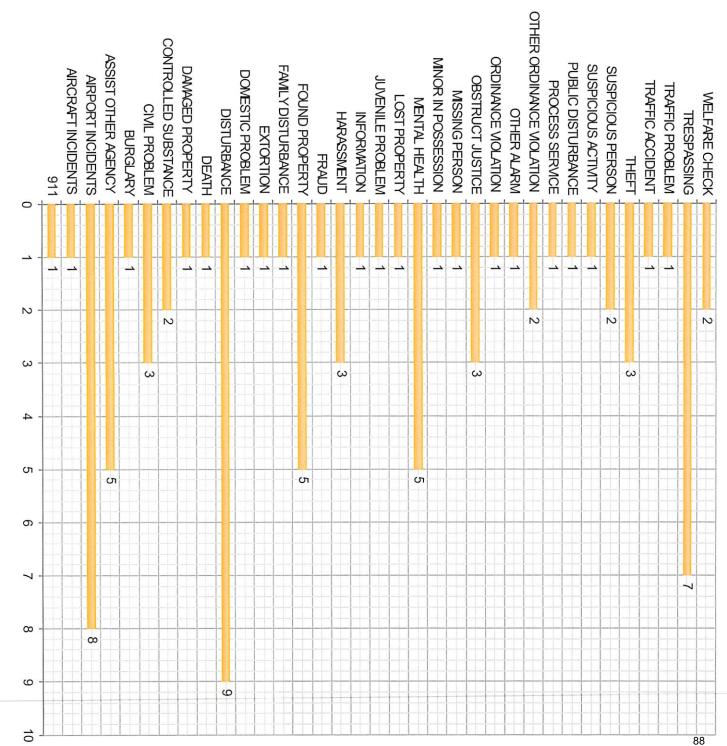
