

- Town of Hayden is developing its first-ever Community Health Assessment and Action Plan (CHAAP). The CHAAP will outline actionable strategies, collaboration opportunities, and a long-term vision for health in Hayden.
- 2.) The Town is also updating its Development Code (Title 10 of the Municipal Code), which regulates how property can be used and subdivided in Hayden. Where applicable, recommendations from the CHAAP will be used to inform updates to the Development Code.




Engagement Takeaways

- Answers emphasized the importance of the social determinants of health
- When asked about community resources they need the most, participants wanted to see more healthcare services, affordable housing, childcare or early education, and transportation options
- Participants value the friendly people; safe neighborhoods; and environment, natural spaces, and parks in Hayden
- Most common community gathering spaces are parks/playgrounds, local events/festivals, and community centers
- When asked about barriers that prevent people in the community from using existing resources, participants noted: **limited awareness of available resources** and **limited** hours of operation


Which community resources are most needed in your area? Please select all that apply.




Where do people in your community gather? Please check all that apply.



Which community resources are most needed in your area? Please select all that apply.




What barriers prevent people in your community from using existing resources? Please select all that apply.

Factors that received the most responses were:



Employment opportunities that provide a living wage (45.8%, 22 responses)



Affordable housing (41.7%, 20 responses)



Access to primary care (i.e. pediatrician, family doctor) (37.5%, 18 responses)



Clean water and environment (35.4%, 17 responses)

Access to specialty care (i.e., neurologists, cardiologist, gynecology) (24.4%, 11 responses)




Access to mental health and substance use treatment (22.2%, 10 responses)


Participants identified that they were concerned about the following health problems in their community:


- 1. Poor mental health and suicide & suicidality

- 3. Unsafe driving behaviors (texting, aggressive, distracted, impaired)




